The National Conference program is developed by CCPPP in cooperation with our government and private sector members. It is designed to provide opportunities to discuss current issues arising in the development of PPP in this country and to showcase domestic and international projects of note. A mix of both general and technical sessions will offer something for everyone – whether you are a seasoned expert or new to the field.

Over 500 people working in PPP will assemble in Toronto for this two day meeting. If you work in the P3 field, whether in government or the private sector, you will not want to miss this national event.

**DAY ONE** A veritable Who's Who in Canada will look at P3 from a variety of perspectives. Bank of Canada Governor **David Dodge** will set the stage for PPP by discussing the importance of increasing Canada's productivity. **Hon. John Godfrey** will give us his government's take on PPP and where it fits with their objectives. The CEO's of our provincial P3 agencies – **Larry Blain, Pierre Lefebvre** – and Ontario's new AFP agency CEO – will update us on their projects and give us a glimpse into the future. CBC's **Peter Mansbridge** will moderate a session looking at critical needs in Canadian infrastructure. Some of Canada's top PPP financial experts (**Wilson, Haggis, Vincent, Hann, Bergevin, McCallum**) will discuss who's financing PPP in Canada and who isn't. And EllisDon's **Geoff Smith** will lead a group of developers, constructors and operators (**Gates, Hystad, Pearson, McArthur** and **Garner**) in discussing what role Canadian companies will play as the market develops.

**DAY TWO** Three concurrent streams providing four Technical Sessions focused on **Value for Money, Commercial Implications of Common Contract Terms, Selecting the Right Projects and Right Procurement Processes** and **Ensuring Operational Performance**. Three concurrent streams: Case studies in recent domestic and international **Transportation** and **Public Transport** projects. **Power Projects** in Canada – a role for PPP? Clearing the way for **Water PPP's, Monoline Insurers** – who are they and what do they do? And much more!
