To end the day, Global Television news anchor Peter Kent will host the 2003 National Awards of Excellence and help us announce this year's winners.

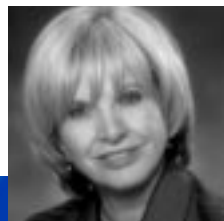
